We are still looking for volunteers to be part of the treasurer team to keep the money in the right account and make sure we are spending and keeping the monies wisely.

We have Karen Hum up and running on the financial secretary position and she is very comfortable with the new accounting program. She has been learning this new system and we feel has now mastered it. The company is willing to work with us to keep it running smoothly. This will help keep you informed of the giving as well as your gifts. Our intent is to keep you informed of where our giving is compared to the budget we all approved at Novembers congregational meeting.

The budget we approved provides for our staff to be brought back up to their full pay packages. This also will get those staff who were cut back on their hours to be brought back up to the hours at their hire. We need to receive \$3,425.00 in offerings each week in order to maintain the budget that was accepted at Novembers congregational meeting. That only includes the unrestricted funds. If it is restricted to a fund, then it cannot be used for everyday operations of the church. We will try to keep you posted on the weekly attendance and the weekly offerings in the future. To better help our volunteers we have limited our funds to memorial, capital improvements, day camp, camperships, building maintenance and of course operating income.

The council wants three things for the up and coming year. 1. To run the business end of the church ethically and faithfully. 2. To keep you the members of the congregation in the loop and informed about what is happening. 3. We can only be church if we all are part of the ministry of Good Hope.
