Happy New Year!!! We begin another year of Our Lord, Twenty Thousand Eighteen. The New Year starts with a bright and brilliant light. The Epiphany of Our Lord. In Sundays and Seasons it says Epiphany means "manifestation." On this day some Christian traditions celebrate three great epiphanies: the magi's adoration of the Christ child, Jesus' Baptism in the Jordan River, and his first miracle, in which he changes water into wine. The word and sacraments are for us the great epiphany of God's grace and mercy. We go forth to witness to the light that shines brightly in our midst.

Epiphany Season: The final part of the Christmas Cycle of the church year, extending from the Epiphany of Our Lord on January 6, until the Transfiguration of Our Lord, the Sunday before Ash Wednesday. The Epiphany season serves the church year by bridging Christ's incarnation and his passion. It celebrates the revelations of Jesus as the Christ, the Savior of the world, particularly in such events as the miracles. The number of Sundays within the Epiphany season is determined by the date set for Easter. The first Sunday after the Epiphany is always celebrated as the Baptism of Our Lord. The last Sunday after the Epiphany is always celebrated as the Transfiguration of Our Lord. (Worship Wordbook)


Epiphany: The festival on January 6 celebrates the manifestation of Christ to the world, recalling the visit of the magi. The date, January 6, coincided with the winter solstice in the eastern part of the Mediterranean world, where this festival was first observed in the third century. The observance pre-dates the December 25 Christmas observance by a century. The number of magi is not known; the fact of the three gifts may account for the idea of three magi. They may have been sages who specialized in astronomy, perhaps Zoroastrian priests from Persia (present day Iran). That they were Gentiles, not Jews, is why the Epiphany festival celebrates the revelation of Jesus as the Christ to the whole world. The gift of gold was valuable, a gift fit for a king, Frankincense was a type of incense used in worship, symbolizing prayer rising to God. Myrrh was a fragrant resin used in oil for anointing and to prepare a body for burial. (Worship Wordbook)

Baptism of Our Lord: This is first Sunday after the Epiphany of Our Lord. This Sunday recalls Jesus' Baptism in the River Jordan by John the Baptist. At its earliest celebration, during the third century, three events were celebrated on January 6: the Visit of the magi, Jesus' Baptism, and the wedding at Cana. All these events were understood as manifestations of Jesus' divinity. This unity began to disappear in the fourth century, and now each event is celebrated individually on its own day. (Worship Wordbook)

Transfiguration: In Christian teachings, the Transfiguration is a pivotal moment, and the setting on the mountain is presented as the point where human nature meets God: the meeting place for the temporal and the eternal, with Jesus himself as the connecting point, acting as the bridge between heaven and earth. The Transfiguration not only supports the identity of Jesus as the Son of God (as in his Baptism), but the statement "listen to him", identifies him as the messenger and mouth-piece of God. The significance of this identification is enhanced by the presence of Elijah and Moses, for it indicates to the apostles that Jesus is the voice of God "par excellence", and instead of Elijah or Moses, he should be listened to, surpassing the laws of Moses by virtue of his filial relationship with God. Transfiguration God assigns to Jesus a special "honor and glory", and it is the turning point at which God exalts Jesus above all other powers in creation, and positions him as ruler and judge. The Transfiguration also echoes the teaching by Jesus that God is not "the God of the dead, but of the living". Although Moses had died and Elijah had been taken up to heaven centuries before, they now live in the presence of the Son of God, implying that the same return to life can apply to all who face death and have faith. January 6th &	Epiphany of our Lord	white	Isaiah 60:1-6 Psalm 72:1-7, 10-14 Ephesians 3: 1-12 Matthew 2:1-12	Epiphany means "manifestation." On this day we celebrate the revelation of Christ to the Gentiles—that is, to all nations. Some Christian traditions celebrate three great epiphanies on this day: the magi's adoration of the Christ child, Jesus' baptism in the Jordan River, and his first miracle, in which he changes water into wine. The word and sacraments are for us the great epiphany of God's grace and mercy. We go forth to witness to the light that shines brightly in our midst.
January 7th	Baptism of our Lord	white	Genesis 1:1-5 Psalm 29 Acts 19:1-7 Mark 1:4-11	Our re-creation in baptism is an image of the Genesis creation, where the Spirit/wind moved over the waters. Both Mark's gospel and the story in Acts make clear that it is the Spirit's movement that distinguishes Jesus' baptism from John's. The Spirit has come upon us as upon Jesus and the Ephesians, calling us God's beloved children and setting us on Jesus' mission to re-create the world in the image of God's vision of justice and peace.
January 14th	Second Sunday after Epiphany	green	1 Samuel 3: 1-20 Psalm 139:1-6, 13-18 1 Corinthians 6:12-20 John 1:43-51	All the baptized have a calling in God's world. God calls not just the clergy but also the youngest child, like Samuel. The story of the calling of Nathanael plays with the idea of place. Nathanael initially dismisses Jesus because he comes from Nazareth. But where we come from isn't important; it's where—or rather whom—we come to. Jesus refers to the story of the vision of Jacob, who called the place of his vision "the house of God, and the gate of heaven" (Gen. 28:17). Jesus says he himself is the place where Nathanael will meet God.
January 21st	Third Sunday after Epiphany	green	Jonah 3:1-5, 10 Psalm 62:5-12 1 Corinthians 7:29-31 Mark 1:14-20	Stories of the call to discipleship continue as the Time after Epiphany plays out the implications of our baptismal calling to show Christ to the world. Jesus begins proclaiming the good news and calling people to repentance right after John the Baptist is arrested for preaching in a similar way. Knowing that John was later executed, we see at the very outset the cost of discipleship. Still, the two sets of fisherman brothers leave everything they have known and worked for all their lives to follow Jesus and fish for people.
January 28th	Fourth Sunday after Epiphany	green	Deuteronomy 18:15-20 Psalm 111 1 Corinthians 8:1-13 Mark 1:21-28	In Deuteronomy God promises to raise up a prophet like Moses, who will speak for God; in Psalm 111 God shows the people the power of God's works. For the church these are ways of pointing to the unique authority people sensed in Jesus' actions and words. We encounter that authority in God's word, around which we gather, the word that trumps any lesser spirit that would claim power over us, freeing us to follow Jesus.




