In his reflection, **(The Cost of Nondiscipleship)** that was in the November 2019 Living Lutheran Magazine, William Flippin Jr., an assistant to the Bishop with the Southeastern Pennsylvania Synod, said, “As Christ’s disciples, we have received unmerited justification “by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus” (Romans 3:24). We lose nothing of value in becoming disciples; instead, we gain our very lives.” The next paragraph says “The best missional strategy is to make disciples and deploy them. But to those who practice nondiscipleship, who live for their own sake, should fear the day of the Lord. For them, physically surviving political and natural upheavals has no consequence because they continue to invest only in things and keep trying to buy God’s pardon with gifts”. And at last he finishes with “Nondiscipleship is a practice that costs us abundant life, as Jesus pointed out when he revealed that “those who want to save their life will lose it” (Luke 9:24). The cost of nondiscipleship, ultimately, is death, not just of the church as the institution we know it as, but of the soul.”

We need to learn to be disciples and find our abundance so we can share. We do not belong to ourselves, we belong to the one and only Jesus Christ our savior, our very life. Today I was reminded why I am always in a rush to do ministry. I have been reminded why the book of Mark is always saying immediately! I have lost another person to death and it hit hard. Bob was a person whom I did not always agree with, but I have always cared about and loved him. He was with us in a blink of an eye I was trying to write my front page and the phone rang. It was Bob’s Mom Brenda and she explained that Bob was dead!!!!!! I could not believe it! I could not hear it. Then I got it. In a blink of an eye we can be here or be gone. That was in November and I just stopped writing.

Vital congregations experience heightened worship, prayer, study of scripture, and sharing of testimony as they discern the presence and will of God in their midst.”

Vital congregations do these three things:

1. Strengthen Their relationship with God

- A. Leadership articulates how God shows up in and through the congregation and its people.
- B. The congregation has a clear understanding of God’s larger mission and members know their purpose in this time and place.
- C. The congregation can articulate that purpose and create a plan for implementation.

2. Nurtures Relationships

- A. Relationships among leadership, pastor and staff, and members create a loving community with good communication
- B. People work together respectfully through successes and challenges
- C. There is a sense of ownership and belonging that drives the commitment and engagement in the mission of the church

3. A strong presence in the community

- A. The congregation opens its doors to welcome the stranger and goes beyond its doors to share the love of Jesus Christ.
- B. Creates and nurtures partnerships within the Community to make a positive impact on the strength of the community.

This is my prayer for us to continue to be vital in the life of the church and community.

December 1st	First Sunday of Advent	blue	Isaiah 2: 1-5 Psalm 122 Romans 13: 11-14 Matthew 24: 36-44	The new church year begins with a wake-up call: Christ is coming soon! In today's readings both Paul and Jesus challenge us to wake from sleep, for we know neither the day nor hour of the Lord's coming. Isaiah proclaims the day when God will gather all people on the holy mountain and there will be no more war or suffering. Though we vigilantly watch for the promised day of salvation, we wait for what we already have: Christ comes among us this day as the word and meal that strengthens our faith in the promises of God.
December 8th	Second Sunday of Advent	blue	Isaiah 11: 1-10 Psalm 72: 1-7, 18-19 Romans 15: 4-13 Matthew 3: 1-12	At the heart of our Advent preparation stands John the Baptist, who calls us to repent and make a new beginning. As the darkness increases we turn toward the approaching light of Christ. For Christians he is the root of Jesse, the righteous judge who welcomes all, especially the poor and meek of the earth. We wait with hope for that day when the wolf will dwell with the lamb, and there will be no more hurt or destruction. From the Lord's table we are sent in the spirit of John the Baptist to proclaim that in Christ the kingdom of God has come near.
December 15th	Third Sunday of Advent	blue	Isaiah 35: 1-10 Psalm 146: 5-10 James 5: 7-10 Matthew 11: 2-11	A note of joyful expectation marks today's worship. Isaiah announces that the desert shall rejoice and blossom, and Jesus points to the unexpected and transforming signs of God's reign. We wait with patience for the coming of the Lord, even as we rejoice at his presence among us this day: in word and holy supper, in church and in our homes, in silent reflection and in works of justice and love. We pray that God would open our eyes and ears to the wonders of Christ's advent among us.
December 22nd	Fourth Sunday of Advent	blue	Isaiah 7: 10-16 Psalm 80: 1-7, 17-19 Romans 1: 1-7 Matthew 1: 18-25	Today Isaiah prophesies that a young woman will bear a son and name him Emmanuel. The gospel is Matthew's account of the annunciation and birth of the one named Emmanuel, God-with-us. During these final days of Advent we pray, "O come, O come, Emmanuel," a beloved hymn based on the O Antiphons, ancient prayers appointed for the seven days preceding Christmas. On this final Sunday of Advent we prepare to celebrate the birth of the one born to save us from the power of sin and death.
December 29th	First Sunday of Christmas	white	Isaiah 63: 7-9 Psalm 148 Hebrews 2: 10-18 Matthew 2: 13-23	As we celebrate the Twelve Days of Christmas, our gospel today confronts us with the death of innocent children at the hands of Herod. The birth of Christ does not remove the power of evil from our world, but its light gives us hope as we walk with all the "holy innocents" of past generations and today who have suffered unjustly. In our gathering around word and meal, God continues to redeem us, lift us up, and carry us as in days of old.

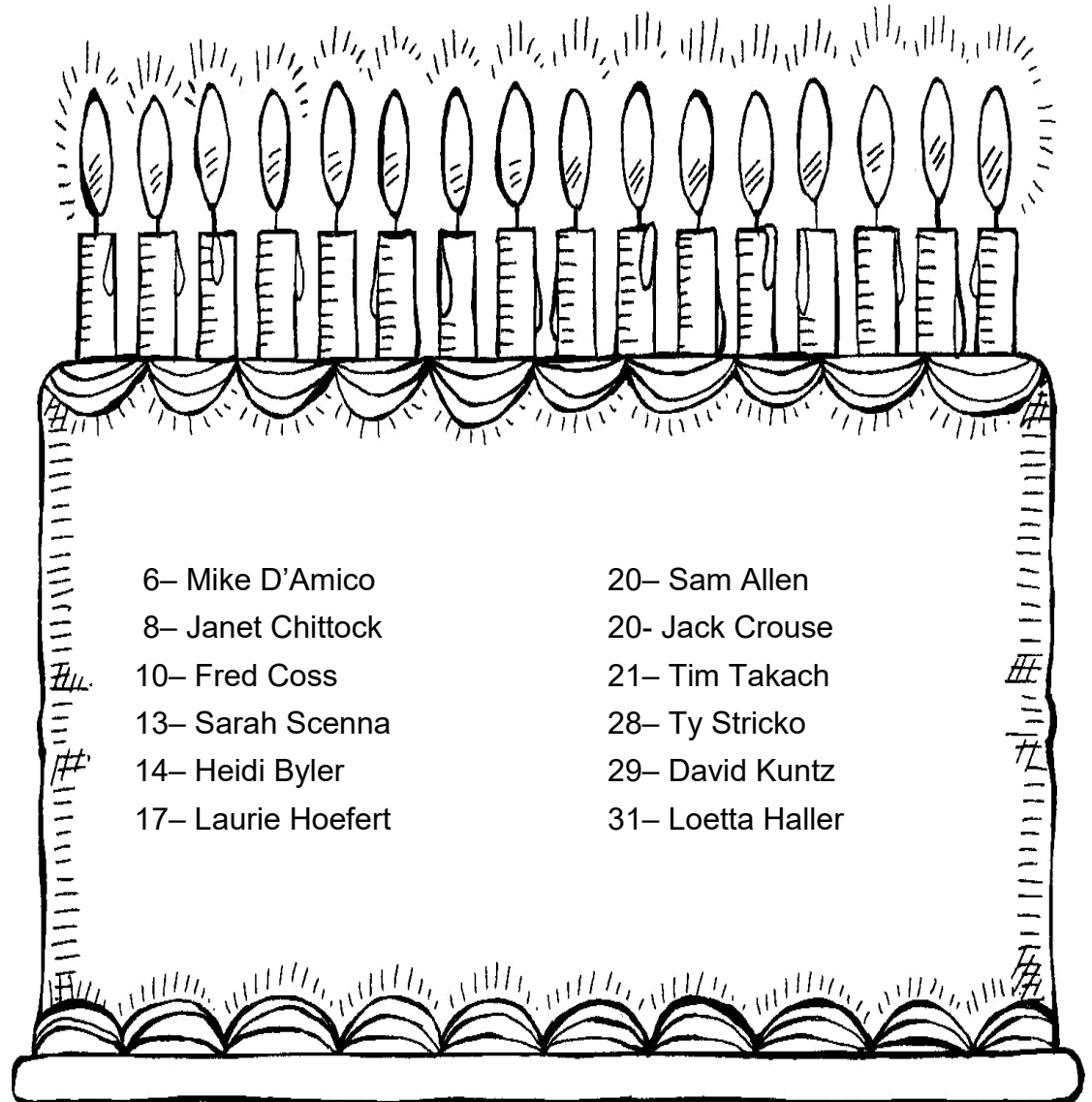

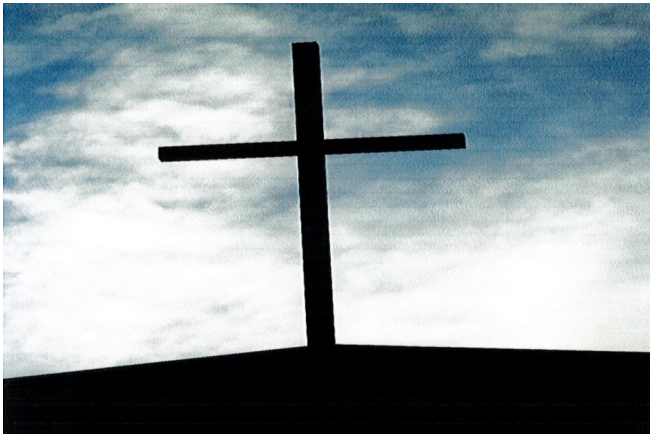


COOKIE EXCHANGE
