My concern and love for my people is at its peak. I am held back by the rules and social concerns. I have not slept well since this all started, between my friends dying and then my fur baby almost dying. Between the confusion of these times. You know? Right? There is a new bug out there. A new way to be slowed down. Infected! If you get the virus, it drains your body of strength. I have the humble pleasure to be the person a few people feel safe to call when their life is smacked and the wind is knocked out of them. Helpless is a hard place to be and being helpless and not allowed to personally be there is a double whammy!

It is okay not to know what to say! It is okay not to be there. We all are in the same place. Fear is the monster that lurks in the uncertain times. We are afraid to get sick. We are afraid to get others infected. We are afraid to see where our families are going to and where they are coming back from. We are isolated when we want to grieve together. You know, we just want to sit with people hold their hands, maybe cry with them, hug them. We are used to gathering during times of death showing death it is not the victor here. Yet death has brought along with it this social distancing. Fear of contamination, fear of the spread of death. We all certainly know of someone who has died from this sickness and yet we even are afraid when people survive this sickness. We don't know who has had this virus or who hasn't. We are just trying right now to stop the hurricane wind blowing on the fire of disease, fanning the flames of sickness to spread like wild fire, the pain and torment of death.

I know a gentleman who is very intensely demanding for us to isolate, but yet I see him everywhere I am. I hear a woman saying we are not being socially responsible, but yet she is not isolated, but out and about. I know a woman who is screaming at the top of her lungs how wrong the churches staying open are, yet she babysits the child of a nurse, who drops that child off at her house daily! We all are sinners and we all fall short, don't ask who sinned, the child or the parents. Please ask, how is God going to reveal his glory in this?

I recently read a story of a man who was born blind. (John 9:1-12) He did not know who was speaking to him as the Messiah spat on the ground and made mud and placed it on his eyes. He only listened to the directions and washed. He was cleansed and his eyes were opened. He could see!! Everyone who knew him wanted to know, how now do you see? He honestly doesn't know. That man put mud on my eyes told me to wash and I did, now I see. The authorities want to know and he tells them. The authorities did not like his answers so they went to his parents. His parents said, don't ask us ask him, he is of age. They ask him again and he says I told you. Why do you want to know? Do you want to follow him? They did not like his answer and threw him out. 
