To toil and not seek for rest. Have you noticed these really all fit together? They are connected to the struggle to stay in faith and in keep hoping so that Love might prevail?? I don't know about you, but I get tired and I want to just run away! I want to do the will of God, but I feel it should some how get easier. You know like when you work with people and they proclaim over you that you have some gift from God. You are amazing, but yet they don't listen to you. UGH!! That is so tiring. But it is life. I have seen many miracles of God, yet I am surprised every time I see one. I get so tired I start to lose myself and sometimes become that which I am fighting. I become irritable and lose hope. Then someone says you should eat this way, and the doctor says eat this way, and the cardiologist says eat this way. At this point it really is not what I eat it is the amount. I eat good salads and vegetables and everyone says I can eat all of them I want. But that is not true, I have to limit my intake. So, I toil and I struggle and I try to do what is right. I finally get to the A1C I want and boom I want to celebrate. Wendy get ready, I am picking you up and we are going to get a donut. We both laugh and let me stop right there. We should have gone and got the donut. Because what we did was go and have a huge breakfast of eggs, hash browns, rye toast, and buckwheat pancakes. With sausage and bacon! OMG!!! I love food. I was celebrating. I earned it. I labored and labored for this reward. My sugar reading was bad for the next two days. Why is it that I need a reward? Why do we feel we need a reward for doing good? Is it me, or do we all think we deserve a reward? The other question is this. Is the reward good for us? Why is not doing good the reward? Why is not serving God with our best the reward??

Well I hope you have enjoyed a moment in the head of the Pastor. God is so good to us, yet we don't always see it or feel it. That is why we must believe it. We have to muster all the faith we can to believe what God has promised and we have witnessed in the past. Knowing God is never changing. We may not understand we might be tired, but God is everlasting. Dear God, please help us to follow you no matter what, not to our glory, but to yours. Help us to see every person as you do and help us to show the Christ to every person we see. May the Holy Spirit strengthen us and help us to discern your will, that we might be witnesses to your Love. In Jesus name we pray. Amen.


