We know there are different views out there about Pre-tribulation, Tribulation, and Post-Tribulation. We don't need to dig down and have all this knowledge because we focus on the one truth, that Christ is the Beloved son of God. We have been saved not because we were smart and figured out the key or the secret message but because Christ has made us children of God. It is not a secret. It has been declared to every generation. You either live that or you don't. Are you producing fruit or are you just being? I really don't want to be declared a great preacher or a wise scholar by men. I just want to be fruitful and shine the light of Christ in the darkest times. I once had a professor who asked me if I wanted to be a scholar or to get my doctorate in theology. I said I just want to be a pastor who bears fruit. (Here we go Loetta) I just want to feed the sheep. He said you will do well then. I am humbled by every sermon that moves the people of God to know Christ and to trust Christ. We should have a Bible Study of the book of Revelation, Pastor. I say why? Why do you want to learn all that symbolism or study about all that history of the 1st century? Why, when I can tell you this, Christ wins!!! Nothing added, nothing taken away, Jesus Christ wins and saves the people not in this life but in the everlasting life. We are saved by Christ through faith!! That is not going to be easy. It will be hard in this life. You will work hard and be persecuted. You will suffer and die. You will be hurt by the very people who are to love you.

It is like we want a get out of jail free card. You have cancer, no oh no, I have this card that says I am a Christian. I don't have to go through that pain. I get a bonafide miracle. Where do you read that? I get it in Revelation. I know the secret number, and I have the secret hand shake. You see Revelation says you will not be alone; Christ will be with you. His church will care for you and love you. They will bear fruit and you will know Christ is there through the working of the church. There are some churches that will fail you, and some leaders that will promise you they are Him, but they will not love. Christ promises you that through all that He will remain with you and will one day take you with Him. Leaders will fail you, governments will fail you, and the Church will fail you, but God will not fail you.

I have always tried to explain that the scriptures were written for the people of the time. We look over their shoulders to gleam truths of what we are to be doing to bear fruit. We get to learn by their mistakes. To do that we need to know the context and what they heard, not what we hear, and what can we learn from it.

Let's take Revelation about Tribulation: "The life of Christians is lived in the midst of the pressures from a hostile world, which John calls "tribulation". This tribulation is not some spectacular future event but has already begun in John's own time. For John and all the churches, tribulation is the constant context within which the Christian is called to be a faithful witness. (page 91, <u>Revelation</u> by M. Eugene Boring)

Folks don't be afraid. God is with you. You are not suffering because God has left you. You are suffering because the world is full of sin and death. God will walk with you and meet you, guided by the gift of the Holy Spirit and guaranteed by the Son, Jesus the Christ.

August 23rd	12th Sunday after Pentecost	green	Isaiah 51: 1-6 Psalm 138 Romans 12: 1-8 Matthew 16: 13-20	In Isaiah the people are advised to look to their spiritual ancestors as the rock from which they were hewn. Jesus declares that the church will be built on the rock of Peter's bold confession of faith. God's word of reconciliation and God's mercy are keys to the church's mission. Paul urges us to not be conformed to this world but to offer our bodies as a living sacrifice, using our individual gifts to build up the body of Christ. From the table we go forth to offer our spiritual worship through word and deed.
August 30th	13th Sunday After Pentecost	Green	Jeremiah 15: 15-21 Psalm 26: 1-8 Romans 12: 9-21 Matthew 16: 21-28	The prophet Jeremiah speaks of the incurable wound of his suffering yet finds in God's words the delight of his heart. When Peter doesn't grasp Jesus' words about suffering, Jesus tells the disciples they will find their lives in losing them. Such sacrificial love is described by Paul when he urges us to associate with the lowly and not repay evil with evil. In worship we gather as a community that we might offer ourselves for the sake of our suffering world.


