

The Rev. Dr. Laura Barbins, Mentor, Ohio, was elected Sept. 12 to serve a six-year term as the fifth bishop of the Northeastern Ohio Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The election took place during an online synod assembly.

Pastor Barbins has served on our synod council, the Executive Committee, as well as the Finance & Budget Committee. In addition to her current call as Pastor of Celebration Lutheran Church in Chardon, she is also an adjunct Professor of Homiletics at Trinity Lutheran Seminary at Capital University.
