

December 6th	Second Sunday of Advent	blue	Isaiah 40: 1-11 Psalm 85: 1-2, 8-13 2 Peter 3: 8-15a Mark 1: 1-8	John calls people to repent, to clear the decks, to completely reorder their lives so that nothing gets in the way of the Lord's coming. The reading from Isaiah gives the context for this radical call: the assurance of forgiveness that encourages us to repent; the promise that the coming one will be gentle with the little ones. Isaiah calls us all to be heralds with John, to lift up our voices fearlessly and say, "See, your God is coming!" We say it to one another in worship, in order to say it with our lives in a world in need of justice and peace.
December 13th	Third Sunday of Advent	blue	Isaiah 61: 1-4, 8-11 Psalm 126 1Thessalonians 5:16-24 John 1: 6-8, 19-28	"Rejoice always," begins the reading from 1 Thessalonians. Isaiah and the psalmist make clear that God is turning our mourning into laughter and shouts of joy. "All God's children got a robe," go the words of a spiritual. It is not so much a stately, formal, pressed outfit as it is a set of party clothes, clothes we are happy to wear. We receive that robe in baptism, and in worship we gather for a foretaste of God's party.
December 20th	Fourth Sunday of Advent	blue	2 Samuel 7: 1-11, 16 Luke 1: 46b-55 Romans 16: 25-27 Luke 1: 26-38	God keeps the promise made to David to give him an everlasting throne. The angel tells Mary that God will give David's throne to her son Jesus. She is perplexed by Gabriel's greeting and by the news of her coming pregnancy, but she is able still to say, "Count me in." We who know that Jesus is called king only as he is executed still find it a mystery hard to fathom, but with Mary today we hear the news of what God is up to and say, "Count us in."
December 27th	First Sunday of Christmas	white	Isaiah 61:10—62:3 Psalm 148 Galatians 4: 4-7 Luke 2: 22-40	The psalmist calls on the natural world, celestial bodies, fire and earth, creatures, and all humanity, to praise God. The voices of Simeon and 84-year-old Anna join the chorus today, recognizing what God is doing in Jesus. Simeon's song is often sung after communion, for we have seen God's salvation in the assembled community and have held Jesus in our hands in the bread. Then, like the prophet Anna, we tell of Jesus to all who look for the healing of the world.



MEETING MINUTES

Council meeting Minutes for November 17, 2020

The meeting opened with prayer led by Sarah.

Sarah welcomes Nancy and Kevin Barret as new council members. Kevin Barret will begin attending meetings in January.

Treasurer: Kelly states that the church was negative \$8,000 at the end of October. This was partly due to double payments in health coverage. The year to date is negative \$23,000 which is better than in past years. She paid the paving invoice in full, and used \$20,000 in Thrivent funds.

Old Business:

- a. Eugene gathered a team and moved the bumper back into place in front of the ramp. He will also replace the spikes to hold it there. The blacktop in the drain has hardened and does not present a problem. Greg will look at the drain to make sure. In the Spring, Greg will put together a team to re-grade the driveway edge instead of putting up a retaining wall. Greg will also roll the parsonage lawn and add fill dirt and re-seed in the Spring.
- b. P. Ralph met with Natalie Keenan and Angela DeVito to form a team to write Thrivent Action grants for our church events and projects. Natalie and Angela will be contacting Thrivent members to walk them through the process. The church has the potential to earn \$10,500 per year doing these ministries.

New Business:

- a. Sarah and Sue will mail out the staff Christmas gift letter to the congregation. They will also distribute the gifts. Wendy will help write the letter and provide mailing supplies.
- b. Sarah has registered Good Hope for the 2021 March for Jesus. It will be held at the Covelli Center on May 22nd. She needs volunteers for the task groups to attend the February training.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer led by Greg.
