The R E A C H O U T Lent is coming!! Lent is coming!! Prepare, get ready, Lent is coming! So, I have been getting ready to get into Lent by looking at devotionals and midweek sermon topics. Something to help us get better at following Jesus. During Lent, Jesus heads to the cross, he takes on our sins and sacrifices himself for us to pay for our sins. How many of us are truly ready to pick up their cross and follow Him?? Are we ready to give up our lives to follow Christ?? Can we give up wanting things our way?? Do we even know how to serve God?? I am struggling with two midweek Lenten services: one is based on Philippians 2:5-11, and the other is based on our covenant of Baptism. In the meantime, the Presiding Bishop has put out a challenge. No, challenge is not the right word. She put before us a vision. Yes! That is, it. It is a vision for year 2021. She says that we are becoming polarized. We are separating! The pandemic is not helping matters. The Church (the Bod of Christ). Our vision! No, our priorities are: 1. To be a welcoming church, engaging new, young, and diverse people. 2. To be a thriving church, rooted in traditions and radically relevant. Would we be missed if we were to leave? Innovation, something new and useful, learning or knowing our past so we can teach and reach to the future. Understanding our theological view through knowing we are free, yet bound. 3. To be a connected, sustainable, church. Raising the bar together. Covid-19 was an example. We couldn't have large groups in the church. We quickly reached out with Zoom, YouTube, and other web meetings to have Bible study and even worship. The larger church and synods presented grants and ways to get monies to help care for the least of these in our midst.

February 7th	Fifth Sunday after Epiphany	green	Isaiah 40: 21-31 Psalm 147: 1-11, 20c 1 Corinthians 9: 16-23 Mark 1: 29-39	In Isaiah the one God who sits above the earth and numbers the stars also strengthens the powerless. So in Jesus' healing work we see the hand of the creator God, lifting up the sick woman to health and service (diakonia). Like Simon's mother-in-law, we are lifted up and healed to serve. Following Jesus, we strengthen the powerless; like Jesus, we seek to renew our own strength in quiet times of prayer.
February 14th	Transfiguration of Our Lord	white	2 Kings 2: 1-12 Psalm 50: 1-6 2 Corinthians 4: 3-6 Mark 9: 2-9	The Sundays after Epiphany began with Jesus' baptism and end with three disciples' vision of his transfiguration. In Mark's story of Jesus' baptism, apparently only Jesus sees the Spirit descending and hears the words from heaven. But now Jesus' three closest friends hear the same words naming him God's Beloved. As believers, Paul writes, we are enabled to see the God-light in Jesus' face, because the same God who created light in the first place has shone in our hearts to give us that vision. The light of God's glory in Jesus has enlightened us through baptism and shines in us also for others to see.
February 21st	First Sunday in Lent	purple	Genesis 9: 8-17 Psalm 25: 1-10 1 Peter 3: 18-22 Mark 1: 9-15	On Ash Wednesday the church began its journey toward baptismal immersion in the death and resurrection of Christ. This year, the Sundays in Lent lead us to focus on five covenants God makes in the Hebrew Scriptures and to use them as lenses through which to view baptism. First Peter connects the way God saved Noah's family in the flood with the way God saves us through the water of baptism. The baptismal covenant is made with us individually, but the new life we are given in baptism is for the sake of the whole world.
February 28th	Third Sunday in Lent	purple	Genesis 17: 1-7, 15-16 Psalm 22: 23-31 Romans 4: 13-25 Mark 8: 31-38	The second covenant in this year's Lenten readings is the one made with Abraham and Sarah: God's promise to make them the ancestors of many, with whom God will remain in everlasting covenant. Paul says this promise comes to all who share Abraham's faith in the God who brings life into being where there was no life. We receive this baptismal promise of resurrection life in faith. Sarah and Abraham receive new names as a sign of the covenant, and we too get new identities in baptism, as we put on Christ.
