We have had new people join us. We have people in our midst who are hurting and in need of connection to the church, yet they don't have the trust in church. The church is the very thing that has hurt them. (As I write this, I am sitting under one of the trees in the back yard and a bird flew through and dropped a bomb on the table right next to my computer. Talk about not having faith.) But seriously, we have people hurting all around us for many reasons. 2020 did not help to encourage the world. We as followers of Christ must have faith in Christ, not the world. We must stand out to help those in need and those who are hurting. We help by getting strong in the Word and having faith to help us get through the storms ourselves. Once we see how God can help us and strengthen us and move us to that new creation, we watch the old self pass away. We can share with those around us the encouragement we ourselves have received from God. We are strong enough to walk beside the hurting, helping to give them strength in their time of need.

Have you ever felt your heart change? At first you say no to the plan God has laid out for you, then you start to feel something inside and you change. I have times when I start to get bitter and then Wendy says something, or I read some scripture, and I realize that I am in the wrong and I need to repent and turn back to God. I slowly lose my faith and then I get refreshed in the word. It usually feels like a trigger of emotion and pain. Then there is a relief. A burden lifted. God has a plan for my life. I just have to live and love God to live out that plan. To love God, I must take care of my temple (my body) and love my neighbor. He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God??

You are the eyes and ears of the body of Christ. You are the hands and feet of Christ in the church. God's work, our hands. Our job, as members of the church, is to see the needs of our neighbors and then report those needs back to the church, with options on what you along with us can do about those needs. If you cannot figure something out, then we come back to the church and ask for prayers. As we pray about those needs, we think of ways in which we can fulfill the needs. We the church then try to think of ways to fulfill the needs of our neighbor and if we cannot come up with the answer, we call on the larger church and call the synod asking for prayers and help for our neighbors. They will pray and try to help us to help our neighbor, but if they cannot come up with a solution, then they raise the situation to the higher church body, the E.L.C.A., and they begin to pray with us and figure out a way in which they can help us to help our neighbor. With all of us involved, something will come up! But it starts with us asking our neighbor what they need and what they think can be done.

I pray that each and every member of Good Hope Lutheran Church knows and acts like a Child of God, Sealed by the Holy Spirit, and marked with the cross of Christ.

August 1st	Tenth Sunday after Pentecost	green	Exodus 16: 2-4, 9-15 Psalm 78: 23-29 Ephesians 4: 1-16 John 6: 24-35	Apparently not satisfied by Jesus' feeding of thousands, some who were there press him for a sign of his power; perhaps it is daily manna they want. As always in John's gospel when people want a sign, Jesus offers himself. He is the bread come from heaven to give life to the world. He calls us to come to him and believe in him, and through that relationship to know the one who sent him.	
August 8th	Eleventh Sunday after Pentecost	green	1 Kings 19: 4-8 Psalm 34: 1-8 Ephesians 4:25—5:2 John 6: 35, 41-51	Jesus says that the bread he gives for the life of the world is his flesh, and whoever eats this bread has eternal life now and will be raised on the last day. In Ephesians Paul tells us what this life Jesus gives us looks like, this life we live as those marked with the seal of the Holy Spirit in baptism. We live in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us. The whole purpose of life is giving yourself for the other.	
August 15th	Twelfth Sunday after Pentecost	green	Proverbs 9: 1-6 Psalm 34: 9-14 Ephesians 5: 15-20 John 6: 51-58	Wisdom prepares a feast, sets her table, and invites all to come and eat her bread and drink her wine. The first chapter of John's gospel owes much to the biblical tradition that imagined Wisdom as existing before anything was created and having a role in the work of creation. Christ, the wisdom of God (1 Cor. 1:24), today invites us to eat his flesh and drink his blood. John's gospel includes no account of the institution of the Lord's supper, but here we can't help hearing Jesus' words as an invitation to the meal of bread and wine we share.	
August 22nd	Thirteenth Sunday after Pentecost	green	Joshua 24: 1-2a, 14-18 Psalm 34: 15-22 Ephesians 6: 10-20 John 6: 56-69	In today's gospel many people take offense at Jesus' invitation to eat his flesh and drink his blood; even many of Jesus' disciples peel off. This is the backdrop in John's gospel for Peter's confession of faith. "To whom can we go?" asks Peter, in words we sometimes sing just before the gospel is read. "You have the words of eternal life." In order to take such a stand, as Peter and Joshua did, Paul tells us to arm ourselves with the word of God. We pray in the Spirit that we might be bold ambassadors of the gospel.	
August 29th	Fourteenth Sunday after Pentecost	green	Deuteronomy 4: 1-2, 6-9 Psalm 15 James 1: 17-27 Mark 7: 1-8, 14-15, 21-23	Jesus protests against human customs being given the weight of divine law, while the essence of God's law is ignored. True uncleanness comes not from external things, but from the intentions of the human heart. Last week Jesus told us "the words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life" (John 6:63). Now James says God has given us birth by the word of truth. We who were washed in the word when we were born in the font return to it every Sunday to ask God to create in us clean hearts.

Dear Good Hope Church Family,

An important part of our daily walk with Jesus is how we use the money God has entrusted to us. This is such an important part of the walk, that Jesus talked with his first disciples more about money and possessions than about any other topic, except for the kingdom of God itself. Since money was so important on Jesus' walk, it needs to be an important part of our walk with Jesus. On your walk with Jesus, please consider your own giving.

Jesus often taught his followers about the important relationship between faith and giving generously. We can think of his conversation with the rich ruler and his comments to his disciples as they watched the widow place two copper coins in the temple treasury.

We believe that everything we have is a trust from God, given to us to care for and manage. What we do with our money is very much a part of our relationship with our Lord. It is also important to remember that when Jesus talks about giving, he never talks about the need of the church to receive, he always talks about the need of the giver to give as an expression of a sincere faith.

A recent example of faith is the member who gave a generous donation to the capital improvement fund in order to purchase an electronic sign for our corner. She then asked the congregation, through Pastor Ralph, to give also. Her goal is to be able to get more information out to our community. She feels that the more people we can reach, the more we can help. She has faith in Good Hope to help reach this goal.


