The following is from the <u>Worship Wordbook</u> a Practical Guide for Parish Worship Ralph R Van Loon, S. Anita Stauffer. Augsburg Fortress, Minneapolis, 1995.

Christmas

Old English: "The Mass of Christ" The celebration of the Nativity of Our Lord. When the Word became flesh (John 1:14) through the birth of Jesus Christ. The actual date of Christ birth is not known. The fourth-century Church's decision to select December 25 as the day to commemorate the Incarnation was based on the assumption that Jesus' conception was on March 25, and hence his birth was celebrated nine months later. The celebration of the birth of Christ is preceded by The Advent season, a four-week period of preparation for the nativity of the Lord. In contrast to the subdued and austere mood of Advent, Christmas is characterized by grateful praise and festive joy.

Austere

Adjective- severe in manner or appearance; uncompromising; strict; forbidding: an austere teacher. Rigorously self-disciplined and severely moral; ascetic; abstinent: the austere quality of life in the convent. Grave; sober; solemn; serious: an austere manner. Without excess, luxury, or ease; simple; limited; severe: an austere life. severely simple; without ornament.

Christmas Cycle

The first three seasons of the church year: Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany. The Christmas cycle focuses on the Incarnation of Jesus: Preparation for his coming (Advent); his birth as the world's Savior (Christmas); and his manifestations to the world and his Baptism and public ministry (Epiphany).

Christmas Eve

The Vigil of Christmas; as celebration of the Christmas festival during the late hours on December 24, usually extending past midnight.

Christmas Season

The twelve-day period celebrating the Incarnation of Christ, which begins December 14 (Christmas Eve) and ends January 5 (the eve of the Epiphany of our Lord).

Four lesser festivals are celebrated during this season: December 26: St. Stephen, Deacon and Martyr; December 27: St. John, Apostle and Evangelist; December 28: the Holy Innocents, Martyrs; and January 1: The Name of Jesus.

Advent

Latin: "to Come"

The first season in the church year, comprising the four weeks before Christmas.

The coming to earth of humanity's redeemer represents the focus and principal theme of the Advent season. Advent draws the worshipers' attention both toward the along-awaited birth of Jesus at Bethlehem, and to the Second Advent, when Christ will return to judge the living and the dead.

The Church has observed Advent as a period of preparation for Christmas since the middle of the fifth century.

Several themes permeate Advent readings, hymns and other music: repentance, darkness, hope, watchfulness, and preparation. The mood of this season is a combination of expectancy, soberness, and austerity.

Advent Wreath

A wreath of four candles used during the four weeks of Advent. The advent wreath, which probably originated among the early Lutherans in Germany, is a symbol of waiting and watchfulness during the weeks of Advent.

December 5th	Second Sunday of Advent	blue	Malachi 3: 1-4 Luke 1: 68-79 Philippians 1: 3-11 Luke 3: 1-6	Forerunners and messengers advance the advent of our God. While John the baptizer's voice in the wilderness may be the principal focus of the day, Malachi's prophecy could as easily herald the coming Christ as forerunner of the Lord of hosts. Finally all the baptized are called to participate in the sharing of the gospel. In so doing we prepare the way for the coming of Jesus and assist all people in capturing a vision of the "salvation of God."
December 12th	Third Sunday of Advent	blue	Zephaniah 3: 14-20 Isaiah 12: 2-6 Philippians 4: 4-7 Luke 3: 7-18	Christ's presence in our midst in the wonder of the holy supper is cause for singing. The nearness of the God in prayer, in every circumstance, is cause for rejoicing. The coming of one "more powerful" than John, even with a winnowing fork in hand, is good news—and cause for exultation—for us who are being saved. Great joy is the tone for the third Sunday of Advent.
December 19th	Fourth Sunday of Advent	blue	Micah 5: 2-5a Luke 1: 46b-55 Hebrews 10: 5-10 Luke 1: 39-55	Cradle and cross are inextricably connected on the fourth Sunday of Advent. Between a lovely tribute to the little town of Bethlehem and Mary's magnificent song of praise, the letter to the Hebrews reminds us in no uncertain terms that Christ's advent is for "the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all." It is the kind of tension in which the church always lives as when in holy communion—with high delight— "we proclaim the Lord's death."
December 26th	First Sunday of Christmas	white	1 Samuel 2: 18-20, 26 Psalm 148 Colossians 3: 12-17 Luke 2: 41-52	On the first Sunday of Christmas we find the boy Samuel and the boy Jesus, both in the temple, both growing in wisdom and stature and in favor with God and humankind. We too have returned to the house of God "to sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God," who has gifted us with a savior. As the festival continues, "let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts." It is Christmas, still.


