¹⁹Therefore, my friends, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus, ²⁰by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh), ²¹ and since we have a great priest over the house of God, ²²let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. ²³Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. ²⁴And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, ²⁵not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching. Why? When we gather, we support and encourage one another. When we give our offering to the church that does so much in the community, we will still be here and help the community. God gives us a task or calling. We accept that calling or anointing at our baptism or affirmation of baptism. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in Holy Baptism: to live among God's faithful people, to hear his Word and share in his supper? To proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of our Lord Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth? We say yes, and I ask God to help me. The intention is there but sometimes we run into things that are out of our control such as sickness, fears, and doubts. The promise to live among God's people is to gather. So, God is asking you to gather and you are promising to gather. Why? To help move us along in our promises. We actually need the help of others to help us along the way. Some to encourage us and give us a nudge. Some to show us what not to do. And some to lead us and give us something to model ourselves after. Do you have that one person who you wished you had faith like? Do you know that person who you said, they really don't get this? All these things are to help encourage you to move down the road of your faith.

Today I pray that all the people of Good Hope Lutheran Church are striving to serve God and keep their Baptismal vows. I pray that the road is smooth and straight. When it gets curvy and rough, I pray you are connected to a body of Christ that helps you on your way.


