The R E A C H O U November is so full of things that we celebrate! We have All Saints Sunday, which is on the 1st of November but we will celebrate it on November 6th. People around the world celebrate it in different ways. Some light candles, some lay flowers and others cook feasts for the departed souls. All Saints' Day is a festival observed on November 1st, the day after Halloween, by Christians. On this day, they honor all those people who are considered saints by the church. On the Solemnity of All Saints, November 1st, the Church celebrates those Christians who achieved spiritual maturity. It is a day to venerate all the holy men and women who have been canonized by the Church.

Daylight savings time ends on November 6th. We fall back one hour, as in we move our clocks back one hour. The U.S. Senate has passed Sunshine Protection Act that would end the twice a year changing of the clocks starting next November.

Election day is November 8th. Go out and vote!

Veterans Day is November 11th, but we will celebrate it on the 12th. It's a holiday honoring men and women who have served in the U.S. armed forces and is held on the anniversary of the end of World War I.

We have our annual Krautfest November 12th this year. In years past, the men's group called the Levites, would take over the kitchen and create a meal of sauerkraut and kielbasa, fresh mashed potatoes, applesauce and bread, with of course desserts made by the women of the church. They would have a dinner and sell meals to the community as all you can eat. They made good money which would go to pay down the churches expenses as well help with maintenance of the church building and Parish house.

We celebrate Harvest Sunday on the 20th. This festival goes along with the celebration of Thanksgiving. Good Hope is connected to the 3C's and their food pantry. Each year the church gathers non-perishable food and paper products to give to the 3C's to give to the poor in the community of South Range and Beaver township. We take every thing collected and cash donations to the pantry for those who need help. Good Hope is a place that feeds the Body and Soul.

The hanging of the greens will take place on November 20th after the 10:30 worship service. Different Christian communities "hang the greens" at different times. The oldest historic practice, begun in Europe, is to hang the greens after the conclusion of worship on Advent 4 as a means to prepare for Christmas Eve and the Christmas Season. Live greens are typically used when hung just prior to Christmas since they last throughout the final days of Advent and the 13 days of Christmas Season (sundown December 24 through sundown January 6) with proper care. When used at Christmas, evergreens are often understood as a symbol of the eternal coming to dwell among us as Word made flesh. They may also be described as a sign of life and growth overcoming and flourishing in the midst of the dead of winter, and so of the resurrection of Christ. Over time, other attributes were given to specific evergreens, as we hear in the carol The Holly and the Ivy. Others may hang the greens closer to or even just before the beginning of Advent for use throughout Advent and Christmas Season. When hung for Advent, the symbolism of evergreens points to the unending life of the age to come when Christ returns, the dead are raised, and the righteous enter life in the new creation. Some congregations "hang the greens" as an after-worship work project and fellowship event. Others make it into a more formal service.

Thanksgiving is celebrated on Thursday November 24th. Thanksgiving Day, celebrates the harvest and other blessings of the past year. Americans generally believe that their Thanksgiving is modeled after a 1621 harvest feast shared by the Pilgrims of Plymouth and the Wampanoag people.

Sunday November 27th is the First Sunday in Advent. Advent, from Latin adventus, "coming", is in the Christian church calendar. It is the period of preparation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ at Christmas, and of preparation for the Second Coming of Christ. The season of Advent in the Christian calendar anticipates the "coming of Christ" from three different perspectives: the physical nativity in Bethlehem, the reception of Christ in the heart of the believer, and the eschatological Second Coming.




