We know what the church is doing for Christmas and we should invite them to come, knowing that this church has a special gift of not judging people if they cry or have a tough time. This church allows someone to come and work through feelings and sadness. I know and trust God's word to always be like water coming down and watering the earth. We have faith which brings us joy and hope!

Let us celebrate the new church year, the Advent of the Lord, the coming of the Savoir, and the Birth of baby Jesus the Christ. We have an Advent devotional book in the narthex Ason Is Given for your enjoyment. On the 24th we have Christmas Eve services at 7pm and 11pm. We also have a sending of Go Tell it on the Mountain, to encourage us to spread the news that a Savior is born. December 4th	2nd Sunday of Advent	blue	Isaiah 11: 1-10 Psalm 72: 1-7, 18-19 Romans 15: 4-13 Matthew 3: 1-12	At the heart of our Advent preparation stands John the Baptist, who calls us to repent and make a new beginning. As the darkness increases we turn toward the approaching light of Christ. For Christians he is the root of Jesse, the righteous judge who welcomes all, especially the poor and meek of the earth. We wait with hope for that day when the wolf will dwell with the lamb, and there will be no more hurt or destruction. From the Lord's table we are sent in the spirit of John the Baptist to proclaim that in Christ the kingdom of God has come near.
December 11th	3rd Sunday of Advent	blue	Isaiah 35: 1-10 Psalm 146: 5-10 James 5: 7-10 Matthew 11: 2-11	A note of joyful expectation marks today's worship. Isaiah announces that the desert shall rejoice and blossom, and Jesus points to the unexpected and transforming signs of God's reign. We wait with patience for the coming of the Lord, even as we rejoice at his presence among us this day: in word and holy supper, in church and in our homes, in silent reflection and in works of justice and love. We pray that God would open our eyes and ears to the wonders of Christ's advent among us.
December 18th	4th Sunday of Advent	blue	Isaiah 7: 10-16 Psalm 80: 1-7, 17-19 Romans 1: 1-7 Matthew 1: 18-25	Today Isaiah prophesies that a young woman will bear a son and name him Emmanuel. The gospel is Matthew's account of the annunciation and birth of the one named Emmanuel, God-with-us. During these final days of Advent we pray, "O come, O come, Emmanuel," a beloved hymn based on the O Antiphons, ancient prayers appointed for the seven days preceding Christmas. On this final Sunday of Advent we prepare to celebrate the birth of the one born to save us from the power of sin and death.
December 25th	Christmas Day	white	Isaiah 52: 7-10 Psalm 98 Hebrews 1: 1-12 John 1: 1-14	As on the first day of creation, on this Christmas Day the Word illumines the world, shining forth to bring all things into being. Today we celebrate the incarnate Word, God becoming flesh to live among us in the person of Jesus Christ then and now. Emboldened by the good news of Christ's birth, along with the shepherds, Mary and Joseph, and all witnesses to the light of Christ, we declare to the world that we have indeed seen and been transformed by the arrival of "the salvation of our God." 


