Psalm 119:165 - "Great peace have they that love Thy law {love} and nothing shall offend them." What does this verse mean to you? Are you offended or hurt easily? What does it mean to love Thy law? What law?

The very definition of church (to me) is spending time with like-minded people and learning by the teaching and application of God's Word. Enjoy God. Enjoy others. However that being said, we too often see church as a performance or showtime, an avenue to express our talents, a self-help experience, a platform to correct people, a guilt fixer, a short cut to peace, a needs remedy, a gossip opportunity, or a social club of sorts. So, when we don't get "fixed" by church we look to blame the church as being old fashioned, too many problematic people there or a boring waste of time. Therefore, it becomes a low priority in our life. We see blemishes in the pastor or other people there. If these are the reasons you don't go to church then the reasons aren't the problem, you are. You are going to church to get something out of it only; to fulfill your own selfish wants and desires. Church is an opportunity to overflow with the inflow of God's love. It should be our safe place; a way to express God's love. A place of refreshing. But we just don't get it. We really don't understand all that love is. Hebrews 11:25 states, "Do not forsake the assembling of yourselves together." We think we know better than God, so we make up excuses why we don't attend church. There's the old adage which says, you only get out of something what you put into it. Remember my definition of church is spending time with like-minded people and learning by the teaching and application of His Word. If you have a problem with your church or church going, check your own love status quo or your current love barometer.

Church is not just a place to do ministry. Yes, ministry is important and we should love our community and help people. Where should ministry start? It begins right where you are. It begins with those under your roof or in the church pew beside you. Read Acts 1:8. We don't need to revise the programs or institute program opportunities to entice people to come to church. We influence others with the love and truth of Jesus. We get this right first and God will be the one who opens the door of opportunity. Matthew 6:33.

Is God not enough? I think God is fed up with taking second place in our lives and churches. Then we say, yes, but that doesn't pay the bills. We do need to be found as good stewards. Do all we can do to reduce costs and then trust in God to meet our needs. Do we actually call Him a liar when we don't have enough faith that He will do what He says. Phil. 4:19 says, "And my God shall supply all your needs according to His riches in glory." When we need to regroup finances in our lives and church, we need to apply Philippians 13:13-14 to our determination goal. "I count not myself to have apprehended (understand or grasp the situation); but this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, (stop playing the blame or excuse game) and reaching forward to those things which are before (the overflow of God's love) for the high calling (heavenly journey of an intimate relationship with Jesus Christ) of God found in Christ Jesus." It pulls us closer to God through Christian maturity as we "are being transformed into His (Christ's) image with ever increasing glory" by the Holy Spirit's power. 1 Corinthians 3:8. Both discipline and unwavering determination are required for this. Learn to love God and people. Commit now to reading 1 Corinthians 13 (the love chapter), especially verses 4-7 every day for 90 days and be open to the Holy Spirit's teaching and guidance so we can apply God's love to our everyday walk. Remember during this time that offtimes God puts the most unloving people or difficult tasks in our life to teach us how to love as He does.

July 7th	7th Sunday after Pentecost	green	Ezekiel 2: 1-5 Psalm 123 2 Corinthians 12: 2-10 Mark 6: 1-13	Jesus does great deeds of power and gives his disciples authority over demons. Yet none of this power is unilateral; it all must be received by faith. Jesus asks his disciples to go out without money or supplies, so that they will be dependent on how others receive them. When we are sent from the assembly to witness and to heal, we are asked to be vulnerable, to be dependent on the reception of others. The Spirit always operates in the "between": between Jesus and his Abba, between Jesus and us, between you and me, between us and those to whom we are sent.
July 14th	8th Sunday after Pentecost	green	Amos 7: 7-15 Psalm 85: 8-13 Ephesians 1: 3-14 Mark 6: 14-29	When Amos reports his vision of God judging Israel for its mistreatment of the poor, he becomes a threat to the power of the priests and the king. John the Baptist also speaks truth to power, and Herod has him killed. In Herod's fear that Jesus is John returned from the dead, we may hear hope for the oppressed: all the prophets killed through the ages are alive in Jesus. We are called to witness to justice in company with them, and to proclaim God's saving love.
July 21st	9th Sunday after Pentecost	green	Jeremiah 23: 1-6 Psalm 23 Ephesians 2: 11-22 Mark 6: 30-34, 53-56	Mark's gospel makes clear how great is the press of the crowd, with its countless needs to be met, on Jesus and his disciples. Yet in today's gospel Jesus advises his disciples to get away and rest, to take care of themselves. Sometimes we think that when others are in great need we shouldn't think of ourselves at all; but Jesus also honors the caregivers' need. We are sent from Christ's table to care for others and for ourselves.
July 28th	10th Sunday after Pentecost	green	2 Kings 4: 42-44 Psalm 145: 10-18 Ephesians 3: 14-21 John 6: 1-21	Today is the first of five Sundays with gospel readings from John 6, the first four of which focus on Jesus as bread of life. Today Jesus feeds thousands of people with five loaves and two fish. What we have, what we bring to Jesus' table, seems like it is not nearly enough to meet all the needs we see around us. But it is not the adequacy of our supplies or our skills that finally makes the difference: it is the power of Jesus working in the littlest and least to transform this world into the world God desires, a world where all the hungry are satisfied.


