The R E A C H O U <sup>6</sup> For this reason I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within you through the laying on of my hands, <sup>7</sup> for God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline. (2 Timothy 1:6-7)

<sup>13</sup> For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters, only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become enslaved to one another. <sup>14</sup> For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." <sup>15</sup> If, however, you bite and devour one another, take care that you are not consumed by one another. <sup>16</sup> Live by the Spirit, I say, and do not gratify the desires of the flesh. <sup>17</sup> For what the flesh desires is opposed to the Spirit, and what the Spirit desires is opposed to the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to prevent you from doing what you want. <sup>18</sup> But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not subject to the law. <sup>19</sup> Now the works of the flesh are obvious: sexual immorality, impurity, debauchery, <sup>20</sup> idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, <sup>21</sup> envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these. I am warning you, as I warned you before: those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.<sup>22</sup> By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, <sup>23</sup> gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things. <sup>24</sup> And those who belong to Christ have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. <sup>25</sup> If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit. <sup>26</sup> Let us not become conceited, competing against one another, envying one another. (Galatians 5: 13-26)

I spent a lot of time in other churches during my years at Seminary. I went to a different church each Sunday during my second year and my senior year. I was the visitor looking for what made the church. I wanted to see what made the church tick. Was it a desire to self-serve; to just survive, or did they truly care about each other and want to be a part of that love? You could feel as they spoke to us, or didn't speak to us, whether they wanted to get to know us or not. We truly had a great time visiting and learning about churches. But in some cases we were disappointed and let down my the church. Many did not preach the gospel. They preached about Lutheran history and other historical pastors and preachers. I wanted to hear the good news of Jesus Christ. I wanted to hear how I could serve God and thank God for the grace given to me. I wanted to hear stories of those who struggle with sin and faith. How did they get through those things? What is truly needed is not the building project, but how the building project could help the Gospel get to that one person who is struggling and hurting. How can Christ be real today? I want to know about the history of this church's ministry and what can we do next? What are our gifts, and how can we use them to spread the good news of Christ in our life?

It is not how pretty our building is or how pretty we can dress up. But how true is our worship to real life? How does Good Hope share joy, peace, and kindness? Where is our generosity? How do we show our faith or our struggle with faith? Where is the love? Laugh out loud. There is joy in this place. I have seen it. We laugh and we joke as we serve. It was when someone didn't have enough money for a fish dinner, or they only had a credit card to pay for lasagna, and we said no worry, just take the meal, it will be okay and they were surprised. That is how it is with the gospel. We come knowing we can't pay for our sins and Jesus says no worries, I got this for you. We struggle with what to say. Jesus says no problem, we will settle up. You can deliver the news to others. Forgive them. Feed them and nurture the least of these little ones as I have you.

My prayer for Good Hope is that each of us get caught saying to our neighbors: <sup>28</sup>Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. <sup>29</sup>Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. <sup>30</sup>For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." (Matthew 11:28-30)

November 3rd	All Saints Sunday	white	Isaiah 25: 6-9 Psalm 24 Revelation 21: 1-6a John 11: 32-44	Of all three years of the lectionary cycle, this year's All Saints readings have the most tears. Isaiah and Revelation look forward to the day when God will wipe away all tears; in John's gospel, Jesus weeps along with Mary and all the gathered mourners before he demonstrates his power over death. On All Saints Day we celebrate the victory won for all the faithful dead, but we grieve for our beloved dead as well, knowing that God honors our tears. We bring our grief to the table and find there a foretaste of Isaiah's feast to come.
November 10th	25th Sunday after Pentecost	green	1 Kings 17: 8-16 Psalm 146 Hebrews 9: 24-28 Mark 12: 38-44	Widows are visible everywhere in today's readings. Jesus denounces those scribes who pray impressive prayers but devour widows' houses. He commends the poor widow who in his view gave far more than the major donors. Jesus doesn't see her simply as an object of compassion or charity. She, like the widow of Zarephath who shares her last bit of food with Elijah, does something of great importance.
November 17th	26th Sunday after Pentecost	green	Daniel 12:1-3 Psalm 16 Hebrews 10: 11-25 Mark 13: 1-8	November begins with All Saints Day and ends in or near Advent, when we anticipate Christ's coming again. It is fitting, then, that the readings today tell of the final resurrection and the end time. In the turmoil of hope, fear, and disbelief that these predictions provoke in us, Hebrews sounds a note of confident trust. Christ makes a way for us where there is no way, and we walk it confidently, our hearts and bodies washed in baptismal water, trusting the one who has promised forgiveness. The more we see the last day approaching, the more important it is to meet together to provoke one another to love.
November 24th	Christ the King	white	Daniel 7: 9-10, 13-14 Psalm 93 Revelation 1: 4b-8 John 18: 33-37	Even after Israel had experienced the vagaries of kings, the people still longed for a true king to set things right. He would have the king's title of Anointed One (Messiah); he would be the "one like a human being" (Son of Man) given dominion in Daniel's vision. Jesus is given these titles, even though he is nothing like an earthly king. His authority comes from the truth to which he bears witness, and those who recognize the truth voluntarily listen to him. We look forward to the day he is given dominion, knowing his victory will be the nonviolent victory of love.


