- ⁹ Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven. ²⁰ For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." (Matthew 18:19,20)
- ¹³ Are any among you suffering? They should pray. Are any cheerful? They should sing songs of praise. ¹⁴ Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. ¹⁵ The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up, and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven. ¹⁶ Therefore confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, so that you may be healed. The prayer of the righteous is powerful and effective. ¹⁷ Elijah was a human like us, and he prayed fervently that it might not rain, and for three years and six months it did not rain on the earth. ¹⁸ Then he prayed again, and the heaven gave rain, and the earth yielded its harvest. (James 5:13-18)
- ¹⁵ But now more than ever the word about Jesus spread abroad; many crowds were gathering to hear him and to be cured of their diseases. ¹⁶ Meanwhile, he would slip away to deserted places and pray. (Luke 5:15,16)
- ²⁶ Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness, for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with groanings too deep for words. ²⁷ And God, who searches hearts, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. (Romans 8:26,27)
- ⁹ "So I say to you, Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. ¹⁰ For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened. ¹¹ Is there anyone among you who, if your child asked for a fish, would give a snake instead of a fish? ¹² Or if the child asked for an egg, would give a scorpion? ¹³ If you, then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!" (Luke 11:9-13)

We are to pray all the time. Pray like you are talking to your Father in Heaven. Pray knowing who you are talking to, with reverence, trust, and faith. God is available to you and is very much able to give you what you need or desire. The question is, do you believe and have faith even if the answer to your prayer is no?

We first need to make sure we are a child of God, and if so, are we aligning our thoughts with God's thoughts? Are we truly aligning our life to the will of the father in heaven? Do we want His will to be done in our lives?

When I pray, I first acknowledge who I am praying to and I make sure I know he is the creator of the Heavens and the Earth. My God who is my Father in Heaven. I then make sure that I know how much I have been blessed even if I don't understand everything I am going through. I know that God is with me and loves me. I make sure that I ask for the help of the Holy Spirit to understand and to receive the answers that God is giving. I look for ways to see God work in my life and I find ways to understand how God wants me to follow and obey His desires and ways. I look for ways to spend time with God through Scriptures, and spend time with those who need help. I make sure that I talk with God on my ways. The things I worry about and the things I plan to do. Most of all I ask the Holy Spirit to help me align my life with what God desires for me. What am I called to do and what are my gifts that help me to help others? I also have been looking up Scripture to memorize. Things I can say to show my appreciation for the gift of the Word. I am amazed at how much is related to what I am feeling or going through at that time. The Scripture I have memorized speaks to it in my mind and in my heart. This is a start. How much does God mean to you? How much comfort do you receive by talking to God? Try it and let me know.




