I said of course we do, why would you say that? She said a lot of people invite them to their church for show and to say look we helped them people out. Your people are actually playing with and spending time with our youth like you really want us here.

I have heard people say things like "what joy you have working together". I have heard people say they want to come to Good Hope because of all the positive joyful excitement at the dinners.

We as followers of Christ must work together serving the community so they can see what it means to have joy in the Lord. There is a joy in serving God by serving our neighbor. Is our church an exciting and joyful place to come and worship, serve and love the Lord? Serving God is a wonderful gift. We don't always understand the mission or where it is heading. We can't always see where Christ is leading the way to, but we know the end result is to be where Christ is, and I am certain that is where I want to be. In John, Thomas says we don't know where you are going, how can we know the way? Jesus says, I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. If you know me, you will know my Father as well. From now on you do know Him and have seen him.

April 7th	2nd Sunday of Easter	white	Acts 4: 23-35 Psalm 133 1 John 1:12:2 John 20: 19-31	The Easter season is a week of weeks, seven Sundays when we play in the mystery of Christ's presence, mostly through the glorious Gospel of John. Today we gather with the disciples on the first Easter, and Jesus breathes the Spirit on us. With Thomas we ask for a sign, and Jesus offers us his wounded self in the broken bread. From frightened individuals we are transformed into a community of open doors, peace, forgiveness, and material sharing such that no one among us is in need.
April 14th	3rd Sunday of Easter	white	Acts 3: 12-19 Psalm 4 1 John 3: 1-7 Luke 24: 36b-48	The gospel for the third Sunday of Easter is always one in which the risen Christ shares food with the disciples, meals that are the Easter template for the meal we share each Sunday. In today's gospel, Jesus both shares the disciples' food and shows them the meaning of his suffering, death, and resurrection through the scriptures, the two main elements of our Sunday worship.
April 21st	4th Sunday of Easter	white	Acts 4: 5-12 Psalm 23 1 John 3: 16-24 John 10: 11-18	The image of the good shepherd shows us how the risen Christ brings us to life. It is the relationship between the shepherd and the sheep, one of mutual knowledge and love, that gives the shepherd authority. The shepherd's willingness to lay down his life for the sheep shows his love. First John illustrates what it means to lay down our lives for one another by the example of sharing our wealth with any sibling in need.
April 28th	5th Sunday of Easter	white	Acts 8: 26-40 Psalm 22: 25-31 1 John 4: 7-21 John 15: 1-8	This Sunday's image of how the risen Christ shares his life with us is the image of the vine. Christ the vine and we the branches are alive in each other, in the mystery of mutual abiding described in the gospel and the first letter of John. Baptism makes us a part of Christ's living and life-giving self and makes us alive with Christ's life. As the vine brings food to the branches, Christ feeds us at his table. We are sent out to bear fruit for the life of the world.


